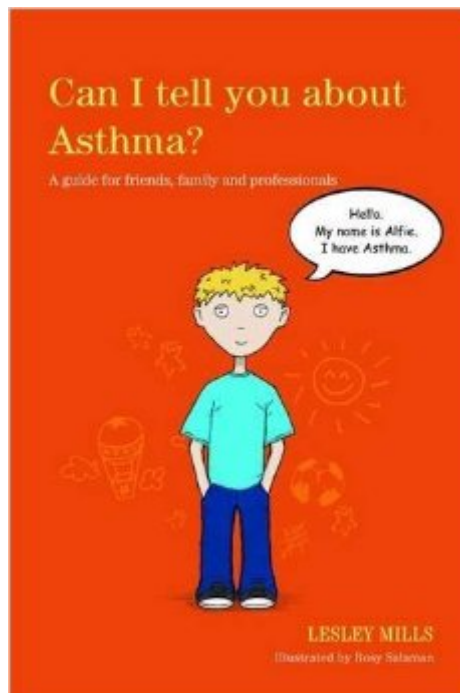


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# Can I Tell You About Asthma?: A Guide For Friends, Family And Professionals
