

Feminists in the Southern Cone countriesâ "Argentina, Chile, and Uruguayâ "between 1910 and 1930 obliged political leaders to consider gender in labor regulation, civil codes, public health programs, and politics. Although feminists did not present a unified front in the discussion of divorce, reproductive rights, and public-health schemes to regulate sex and marriage, this work identifies feminism as a trigger for such discussion, which generated public and political debate on gender roles and social change. Asuncià n Lavrin recounts changes in gender relations and the role of women in each of the three countries, thereby contributing an enormous amount of new information and incisive analysis to the histories of Argentina, Chile, and Uruguay.
