

Book Review on "Wrongful Death: A Medical Tragedy" How does one grieve the loss of a loved one without any answers as to how or why they died? This is the dilemma that Sandra M. Gilbert must face after the successful prostatectomy her husband, Elliot, underwent. Sandra, a distinguished poet and professor at the University of California Davis, produces a piece of work describing her family's experience through this malpractice tragedy. Her memoir Wrongful Death: A Medical Tragedy, was published by W. W. Norton & Company Inc. and copyrighted it herself in 1995.Sandra's story makes a clear argument regarding medical malpractice suits that never change the way doctors and practitioners use defensive medicine. It never becomes clear to her how her husband died, or when. Documents related to her husband's unexpected death were unreadable, autopsy reports were misleading, and the doctors told her they simply "didn't know." Even when lawyers were introduced to the case, answers never emersed. Several malpractice suites occur every year, yet the way doctors practice defensive medicine has never changed. Mrs. Gilbert outlines this book in three sections; Adverse Event, In Discovery, and Claim. Every section then has many sup-sections that are labeled by the date. Sandra writes in past tense, first person narrative.

There is some medical terminology that she uses, but for the most part it is easily read. The book was written in 1991 when Sandra started to get lawyers involved in the case. At the end of the book she writes a series of powerful letters that are addressed to any attending medical personnel that dealt with Elliot's case. The day of her husband's initial surgery, a team of anesthesiologists failed to intubate Elliot.
