

I purchased the Kindle version of this book just after reading "The Princes in the Tower" by Allison Weir. The subject matter looked interesting, and as the cost was under \$2, I figured I had little to lose. I was pleasantly surprised! While not elegantly written, it does provide a high quality overview of the period in an easy to read and entertaining format. Chapters focus on individuals, and since their lives overlapped, often one finds oneself reading about the same event twice, from different points of view. It does appear as if individual chapters were researched and written in isolation - possibly by different people. But, this minor fault aside, the book does offer the reader an excellent abridged version of this period in history. It is certainly well worth the price.

I found this book very easy to read and very informative. It seems to give a very honest and open

minded view of the Tudor period. I would recommend this to any one who really enjoys history.

I very much enjoyed and appreciated the author going through the lineage of the Tudors. Previously I read about each King/Queen separately, but gaps would leave me wondering how it all connected, esp in regard to the three heirs of Henry VIII.
